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Why Typography Matters?

Typography isn't just about choosing fonts—it's about shaping how your audience experiences your content.

A **strong typography** system:

- ✓ Enhances readability & clarity
- ✓ Builds trust & brand recognition
- ✓ Guides the reader's eye effectively

The wrong typography? It confuses users and makes content hard to digest. Let's fix that.

1. Choosing the Right Fonts

Font Categories & Their Purpose

- **Serif Fonts** → Timeless & professional (*Great for blogs, print, and formal branding*)
- **Sans-Serif Fonts** → Modern & clean (*Perfect for websites, tech brands, and digital products*)
- **Script Fonts** → Elegant & decorative (*Best for accents, branding, and luxury appeal*)
- **Display Fonts** → Bold & eye-catching (*Great for headlines & social media graphics*)

Best Font Pairings for Readability

- **Serif + Sans-Serif** → Playfair Display (*Serif*) & Montserrat (*Sans-Serif*)
- **Sans-Serif + Sans-Serif** → Lato & Open Sans (*Minimalist & easy to read*)
- **Bold Display + Clean Sans-Serif** → Bebas Neue & Roboto (*High contrast, modern look*)

2. Typography Hierarchy

*Your typography should **guide the reader naturally.***
Follow this structure:

- **Headings (H1, H2, H3)**
 - Large & bold to grab attention
 - Keep them short & to the point
 - Example: H1 → Montserrat Bold, 36px
- **Subheadings (H2, H3)**
 - Help readers scan content faster
 - Slightly smaller but still bold
 - Example: H2 → Poppins Semi-Bold, 28px
- **Body Text**
 - Keep it clean, readable, & concise
 - Stick to 16-20px for comfortable reading
 - Example: P → Open Sans Regular, 18px
- **CTA (Call-to-Action) Buttons**
 - Must stand out (bold & high contrast)
 - Keep text short: “Get Started” or “Learn More”
 - Example: Bebas Neue Bold, 20px

3. Best Practices

- ✓ Stick to 2-3 fonts max → **Too many fonts = clutter**
- ✓ Use left alignment → **Natural reading flow**
- ✓ Break text into short paragraphs → **Improves readability**
- ✓ Use whitespace wisely → **Helps content breathe**
- ✓ Make CTA buttons pop → **Bold, contrasting colors**
